Setting the Stage

- Legislation: Parents' Bill of Rights (Session Law 2023-106)
- "Parental involvement and empowerment is fundamental to the successful education of all students."
- "To ensure active engagement and timely provision of information... public school units shall...
 - Inform parents of their legal rights and responsibilities with regards to their child's education
 - Provide a parent's guide for student achievement annually to parents to provide information parents need to know about their child's educational progress and how they can help their child to success in school.
 - Develop policies to effectively involve parents in schools and their child's education."

Parent's Guide to Student Achievement (PGSA)

- SBE develops minimum requirements for PSUs by May 1 annually.
- Much of what is required, PSUs already do and share. PGSA will compile in one location for parents.
- Minimum requirements have been set to align with legislation requirements.

Major Components Parent's Guide to Student Achievement

- Includes the topics required by the SBE;
- Includes the policies required in the Parent's Bill of Rights;
- Is Understandable;
- Is provided in writing to parents; and
- Is discussed at the beginning of the year in meetings with students, parents, and teachers.

Minimum Requirements Parent's Guide to Student Achievement

- 1. General Information
 - Promotion requirements
 - Course of study and materials
 - Progress towards achieving state and local academic expectations
 - Qualifications of child's teachers
 - School entry requirements

Minimum Requirements Parent's Guide to Student Achievement

2. Parental Actions to:

- Strengthen the child's academic progress
- Strengthen the child's citizenship
- Strengthen the child's realization of setting high expectations and lifelong goals
- Place strong emphasis on communication between school and home

Minimum Requirements Parent's Guide to Student Achievement

- 3. Services available, such as tutoring, advising, etc.
- 4. Opportunities for parental participation
- 5. Opportunities to learn about rigorous academic programs, such as CCP, AP, etc.
- 6. Educational choices available to parents, public and non-public and scholarships grant programs
- Rights of students who have been identified as students with disabilities
- 8. Contact information for the school/offices
- Resources on the importance of student health, including immunizations



Reporting Requirements Parent's Guide to Student Achievement

- By September 15 annually, NCDPI will accept starting May 15.
- Required elements:
 - Electronic link for Parent's Guide;
 - Electronic link for all associated policies;
 - Data regarding number of:
 - appeals, statements, parental concern hearings, actions against PSUs
 - Attestation Form regarding compliance

Next Steps for NCDPI

- Support PSUs with development of Guide
 - Create an optional template with requirements.
 - Develop "Considerations for Guide" to ease workload for PSUs.
- Develop reporting form by May.
 - Include all components required.
 - Due to NCDPI by September 15.
